There will be two boxes and the one to the left is the one to set-up your account.

We would like to offer our annual all church turkey dinner this year even though we are still in the midst of uncertainty due to the Covid 19 restrictions. After much thought, discussion, and prayer, we have decided to try it in a different way.

First change is to move it to a Sunday instead of Wednesday evening. Second change is to have two seating times and to require reservations for each of the times as we will be limited to 50 in the dining room and 50 in the gym at either time. We will do carry outs that can be picked up at the alley door behind the kitchen (water tower door) at two different times also. So here is what it will look like:

On Sunday, November 15:

Carry outs available from 10:15-10:30 a.m. in the alley. Carry outs available from 11:30 – 11:45 a.m. in the alley.

First seating for dinner from 10:45 – 11 a.m. Second seating for dine in at 11:45 – 12 noon.

The deadline for reservations is Monday, November 9 by noon. All reservations should be either called in or emailed to the church office. The cost of the meal is by donation only. We don't want anyone who can't afford it not to eat. No one will be checking off who pays and who doesn't. But for those of you who can donate, please be mindful of the fact that we lost all our income this spring and summer for Crossroads that helps keep our kitchen operating so please be generous if you are able.

Please know that this information could change if the Covid situation in the county or the state changes. If the situation dictates, we will go to carry out only or cancel it completely but we are praying that we can do some in person seating because we know we are all missing being together with our church family.

And finally, please know that all our cooks and volunteers will be in masks and gloves and everything will be sanitized. They will take every effort to keep us all safe while we strive to regain some sense of normalcy.

I really love our annual Vesper service at the Tate's farm, and to be quite honest, I really needed it this year. It was wonderful to gather together and just be "normal" for a few hours. As I watched the kids fishing and paddling across the pond a sense of appreciation grew within me for the blessings we have. I shared a few brief thoughts about the importance of growing together as a Church Family. I wanted to recap those thoughts for those who were not able to join us.

Luke 17:1-4 And he said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! 2 It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. 3 Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, 4 and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him." ESV

- 1. We have been through an unprecedented time in our nation. The impact and effects that the last few months have had upon us are not fully discernable, but make no mistake, we have all been affected. For many of us, the changes have meant getting "used" to less interaction with others. For some of us, we may have become a bit more irritable in our social interactions. Whatever the extent of the impact of the last 8 months may have had on you personally, just know that it will also affect us corporately as well. Because of all of this, the church needs each other like never before.
- 2. We need to extend grace to one another and be careful to not cause one another to "stumble." This does not mean that we avoid one another, but rather we look to be gracious to one another. Our nation is growing more and more polarized, especially in a contentious election season. Rather than retreating to avoid one another within the church, we should look to prioritize our bonds in Christ above all. We need to continue to engage and interact with one another. It helps us continue to grow and be effective witnesses.
- 3. We need to be honest, open, and loving with one another when there are offenses. As members of the same body, we should not avoid conflict, but we should do it better and more Christ-like, casting off self-righteousness for humility. When we refuse to lovingly have the conversations that need to be had, we stunt the growth of the body enabling poor behavior and creating a bad witness.
- 4. We need to practice forgiveness with one another. Christ is using "seven times" as a figurative example of completeness.

Our relationships have been strained over the course of the pandemic. Don't give up on them... strive to recognize that they are the building blocks of the kingdom!
