Excerpts from July 9, 2019 Board Meeting

Kathy Hull gave the devotional from Proverbs 4:14-15. Sometimes we must make the decision to do less so we can do better.

Minister's Report: Preparing for VBS. Assisted with bus shopping. Discussion regarding Fire Marshall's demands for admin building which will be discussed later in the meeting.

Treasurer: Michelle Hart reported as of June 30: Checking/Savings = \$483,759.73 Unrestricted Operating Checking = \$100,000.00 Budgeted Receipts = \$236,255.64 (\$10,592.46 below budget) Budgeted Disbursements = \$170,820.97 (\$73,210.43 below budget) Average Attendance YTD = 278 Excess Unrestricted Operating Checking moved towards church construction/renovate during June = \$13,736.60 plus \$305 offering designated towards church con/renovate Net Nonbudgeted Activity = \$25,238.87 Balsman Property - N.D. reported the net activity of deeding 2 acres to Dala Watson and selling land to Doug Harter is reflected in the liability TRB Option – Balsman Farm (Net) \$9,204.

Total funds available for church construction/renovation are \$307,392.06.

Trustees: The Trustees have cashed in the mutual fund.

Christian Education: Helen Earls reported Kacie and crew have been busy preparing for VBS which will start with the kick-off this coming Sunday. VBS will be Mon-Fri with Family Meal served those days for the entire church to attend. After the conclusion of VBS, Kids Connection planning for the fall will begin.

Children First: The recent Fire Marshall inspection resulted in telling us the middle room needs either exterior building access or a sprinkler system in that room. After contacting a sprinkler system company who discussed this with the Fire Marshall's office, the Fire Marshall now says the entire building should have a sprinkler system, which would require upgrading our water supply lines, or the room have exterior building access. Best case scenario is to ask for a short-term variance first then use the lobby room if necessary.

Balsman Property: Quitclaim deed transferring ownership of 2 acres, including the cabin, to Dala Watson has been finalized.

Task Force: Michelle Hart and Kacie Lipcaman are added to the committee.

Old Business:

A used school bus, with air conditioning, has been purchased from Midwest Bus Sales and should be delivered soon. Peter Wright has been contacted about painting it. We can save money by taping it ourselves before painting.

Psalm 90 tells us to number our days so that we may gain wisdom. Solomon also speaks to this theme in the book of Proverbs... Proverbs 6:6-11

Go to the ant, O sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise. Without having any chief, officer, or ruler, she prepares her bread in summer and gathers her food in harvest. How long will you lie there, O sluggard? When will you arise from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest, and poverty will come upon you like a robber, and want like an armed man. ESV

This principle is also true with our spiritual walk. It is critical that we continually evaluate and review our spiritual goals and make adjustments or recommitments as needed.

Teachers often complain that summer is a time of learning atrophy. I have heard it said that the first part of the school year in the fall is spent relearning many of the things that had slipped away over the summer. I have also heard pastors comment of the same phenomena in church life. While summer is a time for refreshing and renewal, for family vacations and enjoyment of outdoor adventures, we must take care not to let our spiritual growth take a back seat during these wonderful times.

Some simple ways that we can guard against this are to join a small group or bible study. Plan a family devotional at the dinner table. Go for a prayer walk with a brother or sister in Christ. If you are still stuck, set up a coffee with your pastor!

The truth is that summer is a wonderful time of refreshing and deepening of relationships. I hope that you will take a few moments and take inventory of how your summer is going. In that inventory, consider your walk with Christ. Set some goals...and grow. You will be so glad you did!

Historical Note

July 20, 1932 Pike County Republican: "Great interest is being taken in the concert to be given next Tuesday evening by the Vesper Singers of the Christian Church. In spite of the intense heat, the singers are working hard at rehearsals and in assembling the many costumes that will be worn in the main periods to be presented." (Many singers were involved, including Miss Edna Brown, Miss Irene Stout, R.L. Harp, Miss Madge Carleton, Harry Barber, Merle Barber, C. W. Aldrich and Ed Glandon.) [Maximum temperatures during the week were in the mid to upper 90s every day—and remember, there was no air conditioning, and our nation was in the midst of the Great Depression.]
